

# THE TIFFIN SCHOOL FOUNDATION



Tiffin School owes its origins to Thomas and John Tiffin who, in 1638, left £150 in trust to teach 'some honest poor man's son' in the Kingston area. From 1641 income from land purchased in the area, provided money for the education and clothing of a number of local children each year. By the mid-19th century between thirty and fifty pupils per year were supported by the charitable legacy of Thomas and John Tiffin.

## A HISTORY OF LEGACY


The Endowed Schools Act of 1869 allowed the building of the first Tiffin School on the Fairfield site. The School opened on 20 January 1880 under its first Head, Charles Grist. It moved to its present site on London Road in September 1929, and currently educates over 1,400 students

there -as it did you.

Tiffin School continues to be supported by the charitable legacy of Thomas and John Tiffin, as well as additional funds donated over the years. Together, these form The Tiffin School Foundation.

In 2019, The Tiffin School Foundation modernised, incorporating as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO).

The primary purpose of The Tiffin School Foundation remains to support Tiffin School in offering a truly outstanding education.

As a registered charity, all legacy gifts to The Tiffin School Foundation (registered charity number 1185240) are free of Inheritance Tax.

Leaving a legacy in your will may reduce the amount of Inheritance Tax paid by your estate as a whole.

## YOUR LEGACY

If you would like to leave a legacy to support The Tiffin School Foundation, we recommend that you speak to your solicitor who can advise on the steps you need to take and the type of gifts to consider. Types of gifts include:

 Residuary - this involves leaving all or part of the net residue of your estate once all other gifts have been distributed

• Pecuniary - a gift made of a specific sum

 Reversionary - a gift which allows named individuals to benefit from your estate during their lifetime, after which designated assets are passed on to a named charity

As a Tiffinian, you yourself are an example of how the School does so much more than just foster academic excellence.

Your legacy can make a real, tangible difference to the Tiffinians of today and tomorrow.
